Workshop Description

Evaluating the costs of interventions can provide the missing link between doing research and doing research that gets funded, gets published, and gets policy changed. Evaluating the monetary outcomes of therapies can help, too. Once costs and perhaps benefits have been measured, adding cost-effectiveness, cost-benefit and cost-utility analyses takes just a few more steps. Participants finish this introductory workshop knowing what "cost studies" all too often are and what cost-inclusive research can and should be. Participants see how research that includes resources used and resources generated can help programs flourish. In addition, participants acquire basic tools for conducting and using cost-inclusive research.
